SeniorHelp Volunteers Resume Gradual In-Person Volunteering

Our agency has been evaluating how we will move ahead with in-person volunteering. In the interim while this was under consideration, we began slowly resuming in-person services with the understanding that both volunteer and client had been vaccinated.

From this point forward we have been given the clearance to gradually resume in-person volunteering with clients. The agency has decided we will not be required to ask volunteers or clients if they have been vaccinated.

Volunteers and clients will make the choice about the risk they wish to assume without knowing if the other party has been vaccinated. You are welcome to ask us for this information about the person you will serve and the client may also ask about the volunteer, however neither will be required to tell us if they choose not to do so.

Because we have had many services on hold for a year and infections are rising again, we have been instructed to gradually resume the most crucial services first. This will allow us the time to make the contacts with clients and volunteers and get the process back in place on our end as well as monitor how things are going. We will be assessing which matches to resume first and contacting both the volunteers and clients for those matches. If you are eager to resume your client match, please notify us before contacting the client and **do not restart on your own.**

We will also be sending out new requests for in-person assistance/transportation that we feel are essential and/or time sensitive.
